ORDER.

Dr. Rana Muhammad Shamim, CJ..... It has been pointed out by the office of this court that this petition for leave to appeal has been filed after delay for a period of 04 months and 20 days. Later on, the office raised certain objections which were belatedly removed after a delay of 15 days. The Civil Misc No. 129/2017 for condonation of delay has been filed by the petitioners. We have gone through the said application for condonation of delay. The reasons/grounds given in the application in question are not plausible and reasonable, hence, the delay can not be condoned and the office objections are sustained.

2. We have also heard the learned Advocate General, perused the material on record and gone through the impugned judgment. The learned Advocate General Gilgit-Baltistan could not

point out any illegality & infirmity in the impugned judgment dated 22.12.2016 passed by the learned Gilgit-Baltistan Service Tribunal, hence, no indulgence is warranted into it by this Court being well reasoned and well founded.

3. In view of the above and the law laid down by this Court reported as 2016 GBLR 12 and 2016 GBLR 244 and by the Hon'ble apex court of Pakistan in cases reported as 1990 SCMR 1377, 1991 SCMR 1022, 1998 SCMR 292, 1998 SCMR 1087, even one day unexplained delay was not condoned.

4. Consequent thereto, the leave to appeal in this case is refused being barred by time by maintaining the impugned Judgment dated 22.12.2016 passed by the learned Gilgit-Baltistan Service Tribunal. The listed Misc. Application is also dismissed.

5. The leave is refused in above terms.
